10. Description of good practice and it's activities

Before the respective elections at the level of the City of Graz, the Province of Styria or the National Council elections, questions are asked of the respective top candidates regarding their women's policy orientation in order to give voters orientation regarding women's policy.

The questions cover the following topics:

- education
- labour market
- private care- and housework and its compatibility
- health
- gender-based violence
- political representation
- Gender Mainstreaming/Gender Budgeting

The results are published in News Papers, events, social medias, homepages of the networks and member organisations, and panel discussions with politicians.

In this way, voters are informed about how the candidates from the different parties stand on important women's policy issues.

The concept of Damenwahl was taken over from the Austrian Frauenring for Vienna, Salzburg adapted to the regional circumstances.
